This summer Crieff is creating a trail of 11 Highland Cow sculptures - or Cowches.

After a nationwide call out to artists to submit designs, 11 of these designs were chosen, based on quality, attention to criteria, sponsors' choice, and locality of artists, with preferential scoring for local artists. The artists then paint their sculpture either in their own studio or in one specified by Crieff Succeeds.

The sculpture will be installed to a thin concrete plinth, with plaques providing information on the Cowch, the location, the sponsor and the artist.

A trail map will be produced for visitors to follow, and will feature other points and places of interest, including cafes, restaurants, accommodation, and the unique Crieff retail offer.



The trail will last for ten weeks and will also be incorporated into the Highland Gathering. At the end of the project, an evening of celebration, including the auction of the Cowches, will take place with all proceeds, after costs, being donated to the Scottish Charity Air Ambulance.
